## Zion Forever Project, Lead Youth Program Instructor

### Introduction

This is a temporary position for the Zion National Park Forever Project, Zion National Park's official fundraising partner. The Forever Project supports the education, visitor experience, preservation, and sustainability projects in the park. The purpose of the position is to serve as a Lead Youth Program Instructor to conduct resource-based education (environmental education) and community outreach programs and activities. The Zion National Park Forever Project is an at-will equal employer.

### Major Duties

- Acts as a lead in the development and operation of education programs.
- Researches, designs, develops and conducts a variety of educational and interpretive programs and products aimed at specific audiences. Develops and presents distance learning programs.
- Plans and participates in the development, writing, production, and evaluation of educational materials.
- Supervises lower-ranking Zion Forever staff and interns who conduct programs or provide other services for visiting educational groups. Provides feedback on programs and conducts formal coaching.
- Helps develop a variety of resources to promote and market resource-based education and outreach programs. These resources may include multimedia products, social media, site bulletins, newsletters, and articles for newspapers and periodicals.
- Tracks and records statistics and evaluation metrics for resource-based education and outreach programs.
- Performs other duties such as writing, editing, and media production. Additional responsibilities may include performing roving assignments, providing orientation and information at contact stations, and completing assigned tasks and projects that support education program.



### Required Knowledge and Skills

- Bachelor's degree in natural sciences, physical sciences, natural resources, or disciplines related to resource-based education such as education, history, and recreation.
  - Skill and ability to mentor and train others in resource-based educational methods, techniques, and philosophies. Strong skills in teamwork and collaboration.
  - Ability to speak professionally, and effectively communicate complex subject matter in an understandable way to a variety of audiences.
- Fully literate in computer and social media skills.
